

Comparisons

ADULT LITERACY

The students:

- 1. Illiterate, cannot read.
- 2. Generally from lower classes, or bottom of the ladder.
- 3. Motivation for Christians: primarily to be able to read the Bible.
- 4. Known as the "silent disability," there is little or no outside pressure helping the illiterate.
- 5. Students can master reading and writing skills in the language they speak. Within 10 weeks to 10 months, they can be reading Scripture by themselves.

ESL (English as a Second Language)

The students:

- 1. Literate, can read, usually in the mother tongue.
- 2. Generally from the middle or upper class.
- 3. Motivation: occupational and educational, mainly monetary.
- 4. ESL is better known and practiced worldwide because of the universal pressure to obtain English.
- 5. To master oral English, an English-speaking community is normally needed. The student needs to live in an English-speaking country.

The above comparison was presented to the LEI Board of Trustees by Rev. Dr. Robert F. Rice in 1995 in a paper entitled "World Literacy, Teaching to Read in the 21st Century, The Silent Disability." In this paper, Dr. Rice quotes Dr. Frank Laubach the Father of Literacy. "The most bruised people on this planet, the naked, the hungry, the fallen among thieves, the sick, the imprisoned in mind and soul, are the 1,200 million illiterates."

Member Nation Gathering

Brazil - September 2023

In September 2023, the leaders of Literacy & Evangelism Member Nations met outside of Belo Horizonte, Brazil, for an eight-day gathering.

When the first Member Nation Gathering occurred in 2018 near Accra, Ghana, Africa, there were only eight Member Nation organizations.

Five years later the number has increased to 15! Countries represented this time included: Brazil, Benin, Canada, Ghana, Guatemala, India, Kenya, S. Korea, N. Macedonia, Ukraine, and the US. In addition, leaders from Burkina Faso, Democratic Republic of Congo, Malawi, Nigeria, and Togo joined online to participate in this inspiring experience.

LEI Brazil team members, led by Anderson Fleming, were outstanding hosts who prepared for the enjoyment of our stay with meticulous planning.

At the gathering's opening ceremony, senior pastors from the First and Ninth Presbyterian churches participated in the program.

Meeting days were filled with devotions, reports, sharing of best practices, and significant times of prayer for each Member Nation.

L&E Benin introduced the new cutting-edge app pioneered and developed by Daniel Awolou's sons Jérémie and Schallom. This computer tool allows readers to be self-taught or instructed by a tutor.

Sunday proved to be a day of celebration as First Presbyterian recognized all the Member Nation participants and their countries, including their own LEI Brazil team. The church graciously provided translation, so every leader could hear the service in English. Dr. Sid Rice thanked First Church for their vision in sponsoring LEI Brazil's work over the past 20 years. After the service, participants were invited to a sit-down luncheon at the church.

Ana Biederman started the LEI work in Brazil. Her foundational efforts have become a model for the development of LEI's Member Nation organizations.

One very important concept Ana learned from the late Dr. Robert Rice was to enlist the aid of an intercessor for each teacher and student. This aspect of prayer truly enhances the work and has opened many hearts to the salvation message of Jesus.

Impact LITERACY APP BENIN

"Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so he may run who reads it" (Habakkuk 2:1). God commanded Habakkuk to write God's prophetic message so that those who read it could flee the coming judgment. The triedand-tested LEI literacy method is an effective tool for sharing the message of Jesus through the gift of reading. However, the deepening challenges of printing and distributing materials continually arise. Scattered populations, mass migration and immigration safety, and terrorist attacks interfere with reaching people who cannot read and therefore prevent them from reading God's Truth. These impediments are true in Benin and for numerous other people groups.

Schallom and Jérémie, sons of Literacy Benin's Daniel and Leocadie Awolou, have a vision for increasing availability and use of the literacy primers. Encouraged by a Sola pastor whose main activity is digital evangelism, these ambitious and talented young men, in collaboration with Solaspeaking pastors, have developed an LEI-funded mobile application Sola language primer.

The Sola are a West African populace with only 1% being able to read and write. They know very little about the Gospel. The Sola app offers continuous distance or online learning in downloadable videos or exercises in the form of text from the primer's Book 1.

In the 2023 announcement for the soon-to-be-released Sola primer, the community of digital users expressed impatience to finally learn to read the New Testament in their mother tongue. The project is also aimed at young people since they currently represent 46% of the population of Sub-Saharan Africa. In particular, Benin has only 32.94%, aged 15 and over, who can read and write (UNESCO 2017). These costefficient digital primers would increase the number of people reached by LEI's literacy methods, motivate learners, improve the quality and efficiency of learning, and stimulate the creation of virtual literacy classes.

May the LORD grant Schallom, Jérémie and many volunteers the spiritual strength and wisdom to fulfill God's vision for His prevailing purposes in the world. "It will surely come; it will not delay" (Hab. 2:3).



ESL IMPACT Tulsa OK

Never underestimate the workings of God online and in person. After hearing of a couple's need for English language lessons, a church janitor connected this couple with a member who serves with LEL Connections were made in 2022 for a husband and wife who are Ukrainian refugees to meet with an online tutor to learn and practice English using LEI's "Light of the World" ESL curriculum. After two years of tutoring and numerous hours of homework, this diligent couple has completed all 50 lessons in the A1 beginner level! As a result of their English learning, they have experienced new freedom and

engagement in their Tulsa community. The husband acquired his driver's license and is working at Walmart. His wife has attended a church "women's night" and has succeeded in a community sewing class. Together they attend an Englishspeaking church and have navigated apartment living, doctors' appointments, and essential living accomplishments. Most importantly, their next-door neighbor invited the couple to share dinner and conversation in English. Their evening together filled the Ukrainian couple with encouragement, confidence, and the love of God for neighbors.

LEI Online Training



This past December, instructors and guests celebrated the accomplishments of the participants of Literacy & Evangelism International's 2023 Online Training with a special virtual graduation ceremony.

Dr. Rebecca Foote guided the program's special music, student "vision" videos, and an inspiring graduates' challenge. Thirty-four students, representing 16 countries: Australia, Curaçao, Ghana, India, Kenya, Madagascar, Mongolia, Nepal, Nigeria, Rwanda, Tanzania, Thailand, Togo, Turkey, Uganda, and the US, completed online courses from January to November.


interest after seeing LEI's Bible-content curriculum, Firm Foundations. She felt it was a good fit for the Dream Center's summer tutoring program.


