
INTRODUCTION

The year 2024 was marked by a situation of persistent insecurity in Burkina Faso, hindering our usual activities. Despite these challenges, we have made significant progress in the education of vulnerable populations, particularly through the opening of new literacy classes.

This year, we were able to train and recycle 5 additional teachers, bringing our total workforce to 85 teachers, 80 of which are already in business. This training has been essential to ensure the quality of our teaching despite difficult conditions.


- **IV-** We opened three new literacy classes:
- 1. ** Class Des Foulani Refugees **: 40 Learners (Women)
- 2. ** Class of Refugee Children **: 35 Learners (Children)
- 3. ** Moore Class **: 30 Learners (23 women and 7 men) These additions bear the total number of learners at 105 in these news Classes, and 905 learners spread throughout the territory, through 45 literacy classes.

Languages and Manuals

We have noticed in our country a great lack of LEI literacy manuals for several priority languages, including San, Bwamo and Gourounsi. Currently the only languages that have the LEI Syllable are Moore and French. In order to fill this gap, we plan to request the production of the Syllable in the Gourounsi language in 2025

Fund

For the year 2024, we received funding of \$3,000 from LEI, for the printing of Moore Language Literacy manuals. We can therefore confirm that we have enough Moore Language Literacy manuals. With these funds, we have been able to print over 3,000 Moore Language manuals. These resources have been crucial in facilitating learning and meeting the needs of women learning the Moore language.



Success

In total, 40 of our learners were able to obtain their literacy degree

- : 10 to Dédougou
- 20 in Tiebél
- 10 to Bobo Dioulasso

addition, 15 refugee children from our class received

diplomas and gifts to encourage them. These actions aim to strengthen community engagement with literacy.

Testimony of Miss Sankara

"My name is Sankara and I am delighted to share my experience with you. Before joining the literacy program, I felt completely neglected within my family. My little sisters no longer respected me, and I often lived in the shadows. Not knowing how to read and write in French put me in a situation of vulnerability and invisibility.

However, thanks to the literacy program set up by L&E Burkina, my life has been greatly impacted and has taken an incredible turn. I learned to read and write, which has given





meaning to my existence. Today, I am proud to be able to express myself and participate in family discussions. My sisters now respect me and often come to ask me to help them read letters.

A particularly happy moment was when I received my first Bible in French as a gift. Although I come from a Muslim family, this gesture touched me deeply. It represents not only a symbol of knowledge, but also a bridge to understanding and open-mindedness.

I am very grateful to L&E Burkina Faso for making this transformation possible in my life. Every day of my life, I realize how much literacy can change lives. Today, I am a new Sankara, more confident and more respected in my family.
