Sharing the Vision in

Churches and Conferences

Rev. Carey Jo Johnston presented the LEI ministry at various churches around the Ottawa Valley in 2024. Board members also shared the ministry with their church connections.

We also participated in the Southern Ontario Cooperative for English Ministry (SOCEM) annual conference in October. Carey Jo presented a workshop on the new *Light of the World* ESL curriculum.

Training

On-line Training:



In cooperation with LEI-USA and other Member Nation trainers, Lorna Tatomir and Carey Jo Johnston cofacilitated on-line courses for the Literacy & Evangelism training.

Carey Jo co-facilitated 4 courses:

- Local Language Literacy (8-weeks with 16 trainees),
- Developing a Literacy Ministry (4-weeks with 16 trainees),
- Primer Construction: An Introduction (3-weeks with 14 trainees)
- Primer Construction: Nuts and Bolts (6-weeks with 9 trainees).

Trainees included people from Ghana, Nigeria, Chad, Kenya, Malawi, DRC, Myanmar, Macedonia, Ethiopia, and Canada.

Lorna Tatomir co-facilitated the ESL 8-week online training.



In-Person Training:

We had 2 in-person ESL trainings in 2024. One at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Arnprior where 5 participants learned how to

teach English as a Second Language using the Light of the World Bible-content curriculum. Lorna Tatomir, LEI Canada's missionary living in Leamington, Ontario joined Carey Jo Johnston as a trainer for this workshop. The goal is to connect with the seasonal workers on nearby farms as well as those refugees who have settled in Arnprior.



The 2nd in-person training was at Rehoboth Inner Healing Church in Toronto. The Rehoboth congregation is currently Eritrean refugees and immigrants. Their plan is to reach out to other refugee and immigrant groups by offering English as a Second

Language. Sari Jn-Francois joined Carey Jo Johnston as a trainer for this workshop. Sari had just completed several of the on-line classes and was eager to help with the training. We trained 4 people at the church, but they want to train more.



Teaching:

Sari and Lorna in the meantime are teaching ESL on-line to 7 of the women from this congregation. Sari (in the middle of the picture) was able to meet several of the women in-person at the training.

In addition to the Eritrean women's on-line class, Lorna also teaches on-line a couple living in Guatemala and a woman from Ukraine living in Florida.

The Healing Place ESL Ministry:

Nancy Kingdon, currently Chair of the LEI Canada board, continues to be on the leadership team for the



ESL ministry at The Healing Place (formerly Evangel) in Oshawa. This year, the team has conducted their own teacher training workshops. The ministry continues to thrive with more classes on Tuesdays and Thursdays with about 100 ESL students from 17 different countries.

This group also traveled to Cuba where they led a teacher training workshop for a local church connected with The Healing Place.



Supporting Primer Construction

While our Canadian missionary, Carey Jo Johnston, did not travel to help develop primers in 2024, she has supported groups in our Member Nation partners in their primer efforts through video calls and editing primers. She continued to work with the Y primer in Brazil as well as the M language for developing workbooks. She is reviewing primers from Ghana and Nigeria as well.

Plans are in process for an in-person primer workshop for the Serbian language in April, 2025.

LEI Canada hosted Rev. Mathew Kuldip from India on his visit to Ontario. Mathew trained at LEI's inperson International Literacy Training Institute in Tulsa, OK



in 2018. Rev. Kuldip's church, Church of Hope in Feroziner has a ministry to the slums of his area where




they do medical, food, and literacy ministries. His church is also teaching ESL since English is one of the national languages of India.

pastors, and church members as literacy teachers in the Lokpa, French, Fulani, Sola and Yom languages.


Chabi Leke Minsi

- Gyan teaches ESL to 24 children at the Little Flock Discipleship School as well as oversees literacy classes in the tea district.


