6. One ESL class was regularly conducted as part of the curriculum at Little Flock Fellowship Bible School in West Bengal: 23 students were trained.



7. Tuition centers for underprivileged children:  
Number of classes:  
One in Ballalguri; 12 students are taught.  
One in Bamanpara; 15 students are taught.  
One in Uttar Mendabari; 10 students are taught.
