BRIEF MINISTRY OVERVIEW



Patrick & Priscillah Ministry is a Christ-centered ministry committed to integrating **evangelism, literacy, discipleship, and community empowerment**. The ministry reaches unreached and underserved communities through adult literacy programs, development of primers in local languages, Bible study groups, mentorship, and leadership training. It also supports community initiatives such as table banking and works in partnership with churches, Bible schools, and organizations to foster holistic transformation.

CORE FOCUS AREAS

1. Evangelism (Outreach)

A. Literacy Ministry



We did reprint of Swahili book 1 with illustration, developed & printed a New Reader in Maasai language.

3. Partnerships and Collaboration

The ministry intentionally continues to collaborate with various partners to strengthen outreach, training, and community transformation:

A. Church Partnerships – June 2025

- **KELC (Kenya Evangelical Lutheran Church)**
 - We conducted basic & advance training and provided 10pcs each to 24 literacy & evangelism workers for KELC. For the first time, we provided a package to trainees, which included Lesson chart, primers and printed word cards making tutors work much easier.
 - Hosting literacy and discipleship activities in Coastal region and these classes attracts Muslims. Literacy workers came from the various centered spread in Magarini, Lukale, Tana River among others. The Church offers Leadership and pastoral support



B. Bible Schools and Training Institutions (March, & June)



- Collaboration with Bible schools for: **Narok Bible College- has become a strategic partner.** They have a policy that every student who joins the Institution, goes through a Literacy training. **32 were enrolled last year.**
 - Training of facilitators and leaders, and support and discipleship materials
 - Internship opportunities for students. **We have ongoing Literacy classes every term for none-read pastors.**

C. Community Partnerships:

- Engagement with local communities: In partnership with Lions Club contacted medical camp and registered 120 people seen and at the same time witnessed to.
 - By the close of the year, we had, 8 groups each with an average of 15 literacy & table banking participants in Western Kenya. These advanced groups were
 - Supported for outreach and house visits and discipleship materials.
 - Identification of local needs and priorities

D. Other Organizations and Ministries

- Partnerships with NGOs, churches, and ministries:
 - Resource sharing (materials, trainers, finances)
 - Joint workshops and conferences
 - Networking and capacity building

4. Outcomes / Impact

- Number of people reached through outreach - 1000 +
- New believers and follow-ups -over 100 people responded to the call to follow Jesus during the outreach and revivals.
- Literacy learners trained - our partner Church organization reported having 23 centers with each having an average of 14 learners spread across Kilifi and Tana-river counties.
- Primers developed and distributed (1), Maasai folkstories titled "*Inkaatini OI Maasai*

- Discipleship groups established - 12.
- Strengthened partnerships and collaboration - with LEI, LaTM-USA, KELC, Narok Bible College, PMCI-Tulia Worship,
- Community transformation and engagement - many lives are being changed, discovering of ministries. Held 4 follow-up visits conducting short sessions, encouraging and
