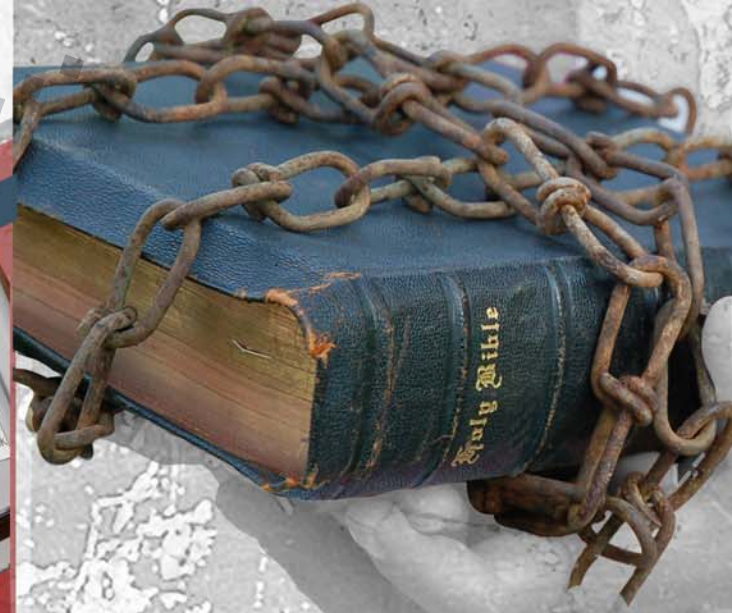

WHAT

IS THE TULSA LITERACY CENTER?

The Tulsa Literacy Center (TLC) is a part of Literacy & Evangelism International. It is a local, non-profit literacy program which offers free, private tutoring for adults who cannot read and write. The Tulsa Literacy Center also offers classes for English language learners.

Results for the 2011 National Assessment of Adult Literacy (NAAL) indicate that **one in four** persons in Oklahoma grow up not knowing how to read.



WHO

TEACHES NON-READERS?

Workshops are held regularly to train volunteers to become a tutor. Tutors come from all walks of life. Often churches or organizations will participate in a workshop as a group.

HOW

ARE NON-READERS TAUGHT?

A student and selected tutor will work one-on-one. Usually they meet once or twice weekly for 90 minutes. A series of books will guide them using Bible-content teaching materials.

WHERE

ARE NON-READERS TAUGHT?

Volunteer tutors may teach students at churches, libraries, or any other convenient location.



HOW CAN YOU HELP?

BECOME a certified tutor.

ATTEND a Tutor Training Workshop.
