COVID 19 disruptions meant we had to embrace technology to drive ministry...but we were reminded also that a good percentage of our constituents still lacked good smart phones and money to buy expensive data to stay online to learn and work.....and so we knew we had to continue to use old methods while we explore new ones to keep the literacy ministry relevant to many. Thank you Partners for keeping faith and supporting us to share the Gift of Christ through reading. Our Report offers a snapshot of what together we have achieved. We wish all of you a Prosperous and very Fruitful New Year! We are trusting the Lord that together we will do more!

REPORT FOR JANUARY TO DECEMBER 2021

JANUARY: Akuapem Primer (Study Book) Construction workshop was in full swing, but was hindered by COVID, half way through. We had to close office and work from home.









FEBRUARY: We prepared toward Church of Pentecost Literacy Project Training Workshops. We worked on editing the Ewe Primer and continued with the Akuapem Primer 1,2 & Workbook. We also celebrated Bible Week with Bible Society of Ghana.

MARCH: We started Konkomba Primer Construction for the first time virtually due to Covid. It was painstaking and tedious but well worth it. (We continued in person in the month of August). With the help of our Donors and Partners we were able to print Mfantse Primers and Workboooks and Asante Workbooks for Ministry. We also contributed Facilitators for the Online LEI international Literacy training.





APRIL: As restrictions were eased, we took a day to RETREAT pray, review, and retool due to all the disruptions caused by COVID.





MAY: LE GH participated in the Evangelism Month of Trinity United Church (TUC). We got the opportunity on Sunday 5th May, to talk about Literacy as a useful evangelism and discipling tool, especially Mother tongue ministry to our young ones.









JUNE: In collaboration with Bible Society of Ghana, thirty (30) trainee Teachers were trained for a week to teach others to read and write in the Bono language.

JULY: We graduated Nine (9) joyful learners from the Krobo-Odumase area at Presbyterian Church, Zimmerman Congregation. Three (3) of the graduands read the Bible lessons for the day to the admiration of the congregation.







AUGUST: Thanks to our Donors we were able to print completed and revised primers: Ewe, Dangme, Akuapem. We also fervently prepared towards Trainer of Trainers workshops for the Church of Pentecost.



SEPTEMBER: On 8th September we celebrated International Literacy Day at Kpong with Compassion International, (Clusters) and at Senya Breku with Bible Society of Ghana. We took the opportunity to interact with the public and answer questions through TV and radio shows. We also completed the Konkomba Primer! It is now ready for printing to start ministry.





OCTOBER – DECEMBER: In association with the National Discipleship, Leadership and Development Committee of the Church of Pentecost we successfully rolled out four (4) workshops (2 in Accra, 1 in Kumasi & 1 in Tamale) and trained (325) Teachers/Trainer of Trainers for the Church for their Literacy Project.







DECEMBER: We ended the year with two (2) other Teacher Training Workshops. One with Bible Society of Ghana at Ho (25 Teachers) and the other for an NGO Sustaining Love Kids (5 Teachers) in Accra.


